## **Social Round-up**

### **Charter Day**

The annual service at St Mary's Old Swinford was held on the evening of Thursday 13<sup>th</sup> June and was well attended by most of the first year students, staff, Governors, Trustees and many Old Edwardians and guests.

The Annual Charter Day lunch was held on Saturday 15<sup>th</sup> June attracting a full capacity gathering in the Memorial room. The event was hosted by the Immediate Past President, David Trewin who welcomed guests Prof. Chris Painter, Chairman of the Governors; Alan Cutler, Chairman of the Trustees and Sharon Phillips, Principal with her husband Charles.

The table setting was particularly appetising in both the culinary as well as visual sense and attracted many admiring comments as members, wives and guests entered the memorial room.

Charter Day lunch is traditionally free of formality apart from the loyal toast and *In Piam...* and this year's was in the words of one guest "one of the best".

Leaving the Park at 5.00.p.m., with brains aching with the knowledge absorbed during the day, we arrived back at the Club and were treated to a special "wartime" themed supper created by Tim and served to us by Tracey. A choice of spam fritters (the favourite amongst the group) or Lord Woolton's pie (Lord Woolton was the wartime Minister of Food) accompanied by mashed potatoes, chips and mushy peas was served as a sit-down meal in the Memorial Room.
